Co-educator Sue Edwards said the kindergarten chose to help Ms Phillips by sewing soft, fleecy pouches to keep the animals safe.

"We put the message out for donations of fleecy fabrics and received a pile of old baby blankets and outgrown tracky-dacks," Ms Edwards said. "A group of parents cut the fabric into pocket shapes and the children helped sew them up."

Ms Edwards said the 26 children had made several dozen pouches under the guidance of parent Lisa Spreadborough.
