Rescuers need safety gear

HELP for Wildlife is seeking just that from the public to help equip its wildfire volunteer rescue teams with suitable protective gear for the bushfire season.

New personal protection equipment regulations were recently updated by the Department of Sustainability and Environment, making the group's current uniforms unusable.

The specially trained volunteers cannot enter fireprone areas to rescue injured wildlife unless each wears the \$600 safety gear.

During the last fire season, hundreds of koalas and other wildlife were rescued at the devastating bushfire in the Framlingham Forest near Warrnambool.

With the bushfire season expected to be severe, the group is calling for donations to help pay for the protective gear.
